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Report of the Trustees For The Year Ended 31st August 2022

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st August 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

# Objectives and activities Objectives and aims

To carry out and promote activities for the benefit of the community of the town of Kingussie, provide recreational facilities and advance environmental protection and improvement of the neighbourhood.

Report of the Trustees For The Year Ended 31st August 2022

#### Achievement and performance

#### Charitable activities

Kingussie Community Development Company has continued to carry out and support activities for the benefit of the community of the town of Kingussie, to provide recreational facilities and advance environmental protection and improvement of the neighbourhood. Full reports of the charitable activities will be presented at the Annual General Meeting to be held on 1st December 2022.

#### **AWARD**

Although it more correctly falls in to the current year, I must start by highlighting the Paths for All Volunteering award we received at the Scottish Parliament. A happy occasion.

#### THE KINGUSSIE COMMUNITY HYDRO

The Hydro continues to perform in line with the original business case. Following the replacement of damaged Coanda screens in September 2021, only routine maintenance has ben necessary. A record monthly output in November 2021 was achieved, but performance was however significantly reduced during the dry summer period of 2022. Thank you to Trustees Alistair Bell and Gilmour Strang. .

#### THE KCDC HYDRO GRANTS FUND

Over the year, awards from the Hydro Fund have amounted to £11,527. Support was awarded for Learn and Create, Kingussie High School Bike Resource, Badenoch & Strathspey Therapy Garden, Badenoch & Strathspey Muzzle Group, Bunting Group, Kingussie Tennis Club, Kingussie Bowling Club, John Bratchell - Hunt, SBSA - Workshop, Kingussie Camanachd Club, Kingussie Business Forum, and Kingussie Christmas Lights Fund. We stress that we have grant funds available to qualifying grant projects.and during the year the Trustees agreed to raise the level of grants to a maximum of £750 for Standard and £3,000 for Large.

#### LAND PURCHASE

We completed the purchase of the river bank to the west of Ardbroilach Road, between the Hydro Bridge and the entrance to Pitmain Estate. This allowed volunteers to build a path connecting the community woodland around the Gynack to the paths in Tom Baraidh woodland. We obtained a grant from the National Lottery Community Fund for this and other work on the woodland. We were greatly assisted by Piers Voysey of the Community Woodlands Association of which KCDC is a member.

#### **COMMUNITY PATHS**

Weekly Work parties continue on our paths with in particular the path up Creag Bheag from Middle Terrace, the Curlew path and the paths within Tom Baraidh Woods being improved and the desire line at the top of Ardvonie Park being much improved. There remains much more to do and I encourage all to volunteer to help - helping with the Paths for All Community Paths Group of the year for Scotland 2022 is good fun. Thanks to Pitmain Estate and the Golf Club for their permissions and assistance for work on the paths. Discussions have been held with the Estate for the repair of paths either damaged by storms or requiring reinstatement after the Estate's Forest Work. A new edition of the Kingussic paths map leaflet was produced with the help of the National Park which now includes the full Curlew path to Newtonmore.

## PATHS FIVE YEAR PLAN

We have produced a Five Year Plan for the path building and repair, which is on our website. I stress that this represents our ambitions, and much will depend on planning and the availability of funding. The plan will be updated annually. If you have any thoughts on the Plan, please speak to one of our trustees. Many thanks in particular to Sandy Maxwell and to the volunteers of the Paths Group for driving this forward.

#### COMMUNITY WOODLANDS

Work parties continue on our Woodlands with unsafe trees being removed as well as other works being carried out. This work on our Woodlands is very much ongoing particularly in light of the Spring storms. Many thanks to Gilmour and Susan Strang for leading on this.

#### CYCLE FRIENDLY KINGUSSIE

Cycle Friendly Kingussic continues to work within the framework of a 5 year plan (2018 - 2023). This year CFK were awarded the gold level of the Cycle Friendly Community award by Cycling Scotland. The successful electronic cycle loan scheme was improved further with additional bikes being made available. The programme of weekly ride outs continue to be popular year round. The annual Bikeathon took place in June in partnership with the High School. A new pump and maintenance stand was installed in Kincraig and more recently a very successful programme of balance bike events has taken place in the Gynack gardens.

#### TOWN CENTRE PROJECT

CFK handed over the development of the Spey Street Junction to the Highland Council and anticipate this will be delivered in 2023. Finally funding support from Sustrans has been applied for, to extend the Newtonmore Sustrans path towards the centre of Kingussic. Very many thanks to Bob Kinnaird for his hard work on this and CFK.

#### **PADEL**

KCDC is supporting an initiative to develop the ground by the Bowling Green in Kingussie. The group are working on plans to establish a Padel Court. The ground is held by the Council as "Common Good Land" having been gifted to the town. Plans to raise funding and consult the wider community are underway.

#### WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA

These have been much improved and we have also given a maximum grant to the Community Council to improve their social media. Many thanks to Gus Mitchell for his hard work.

#### **FINANCE**

Our finances are under the careful control of Len Cruickshank who deals with them efficiently and without complaint. Thank you Len.

#### **OUR BOARD**

I thank all our Trustees and Volunteers for their hard work over the year in question, in the sure and certain knowledge that their endeavours will be continued..

#### Financial review

### Principal funding sources

£14,078 of funding was received from organisations during the year under review.

#### Reserves policy

The total reserves stand at £153,616 consisting of £25,863 unrestricted funds and £127,753 restricted funds of which £107,566, £1,150 and £2,160 are the net book values of the Hydro Scheme, paths digger and barrow and E - Bikes respectively. This leaves sufficient funds to enable projects and activities to be undertaken and to cover costs, without which the charity could not function.

# Structure, governance and management

#### Governing document

Kingussie Community Development Company is a company limited by guarantee and a registered charity governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The maximum number of trustees is thirteen and the minimum is five. Trustees are appointed by ordinary resolution at the annual general meeting. One half of the trustees retire at each annual general meeting but are eligible for re-appointment.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Kingussie Community Development Company

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31st August 2022 set out on pages six to thirteen.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner



#### 1. Accounting policies

### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

- 7.14% on cost Hydro Scheme

Equipment - 15% on reducing balance

E - Bikes - 20% on cost

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
